#### 'TOGETHER WE ARE GROWING TOWARDS GOD'

On Sunday 25th November, the church celebrated the Feast of Christ the King, which signifies the end of the church's year. In response to this, yesterday in worship we looked at the idea of being a king and what that usually means. The children talked about Kings having a special crown, sitting on thrones with lots of riches and servants. We then talked about Jesus being a King - the King of the universe, the King of our hearts and Jesus the King of peace. When asked to compare the two different types of kings, the children gave some deep and interesting comparisons a normal king wears bejewelled crown, but Jesus wore a crown of thorns; a normal king sits on a throne, but Jesus was nailed to a cross; a normal king has servants to do everything for him, but Jesus acted as a servant to us all. We ended by reading Mark's Gospel account of when Pilate asked Jesus if he was the King of the Jews and



Jesus replied simply with, 'That's what you say I am." Thank you to George in Y1 and Finlay in Y4 for volunteering to be the two different kings. We tried to take our example from Jesus the servant king when setting our mission for the week: 'To be a servant to others.'

#### **Advent**



Next Sunday, 2nd December, is the first Sunday in Advent. During this very special time, there will be Advent prayers at 8:25am every morning in the small hall, led by a combination of both staff and children. All children, parents, families and parishioners are more than welcome to come along and share in these short, peaceful sessions.

Also during Advent, we will be sending home our travelling cribs for you to use as a prayer focus with your child/children. Please look out for these. They will be starting off in Foundation Stage and working their way up through the school. go over everything again.


