## 'TOGETHER WE ARE GROWING TOWARDS GOD'

#### Worship

As it was the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord on Sunday, our worship yesterday centred around what Baptism is and the different symbols used in this sacrament. The children correctly identified the special clothing worn, the white garment as a symbol of purity, the water as a symbol of new life, the oil as a symbol of strength given by the Holy Spirit and the Baptismal candle as a symbol of starting a new life in Christ, the light of the world. We then read the Gospel reading of John the Baptist baptising Jesus in the River Jordan. We discussed how Jesus wanted to be baptised in preparation for starting his ministry of sharing the Good News about God and that Christians follow Jesus' example of baptism in order to cleanse and ready themselves to follow in his footsteps and spread God's Word. In keeping with the idea of following in Jesus' footsteps, we set our mission for the week which is a small way we can show that we are living in the right way: to compliment another person.



KS2 enjoyed attending Mass at church last week with the rest of the parish. This week, on Wednesday 16th January, Year 5 will celebrate their class mass in church.

Recently, we have had many requests for Nursery children to attend Breakfast Club. 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Over the past few weeks we have noticed standards slipping around school. We ask parents/carers to support us in our high expectations of children's behaviour and appearance in school as outlined below: **Ties** 

Many of our children are coming to school either without a tie at all or leaving their tie in their desks trays and having to be reminded several times a day by staff to put them on. It is part of our school uniform for Y2-Y6 children to wear a tie throughout the school day. Ties are available from the office.

## **Appropriate Hair Styles**

Unicorn headbands are not part of St Francis school uniform and not appropriate for school. We ask you to please make sure your child does not come into school wearing one.

## Water bottles

We promote a healthy diet for our children at St Francis and allow them access to water bottles throughout the school day to keep them hydrated. Unfortunately, many children are bringing juice in their water bottles which is not allowed.

## PE kits

Many of our children are coming to school without their PE kit on the days they have PE. We ask you to support your child's PE curriculum by ensuring they have their PE kits in school on the correct days. Furthermore, many of our children are bringing football strips and other non-uniform items in to school for their PE kits. Please note, we have a PE uniform outlined below, which our children must adhere to: **Indoor PE kit:** white t-shirt; plain navy blue or black shorts; pair of pumps/trainers; PE bag **Outdoor PE Kit:** white t-shirt; plain navy blue tracksuit; pair of pumps/trainers; PE bag
