In worship yesterday, we shared Sunday's Gospel reading which was the Parable of the Prodigal Son. We explored the themes of being sorry and forgiveness. We looked at how everybody makes mistakes and how important it is to say sorry for these mistakes. However, the most important thing is that we show we are sorry and try to make up for it. We also then discussed how even more important, although sometimes difficult, it is to forgive



somebody. We shared the Parable of the Prodigal Son together and noticed the point at which the son showed he was sorry and how his father forgave him, just like God always forgives us when we are sorry. We prayed together and set our mission for the week, which has two parts: to show that we are sorry and to forgive those who show us they are sorry.

Lenten prayers will take place once again this Thursday at 8:30am in the small hall. This week we will be following stations 10 and 11 of the Stations of the Cross and everyone is warmly invited to come and join US.

Thank you again to our Mini Vinnies for planning and leading a beautiful worship in Y2 last week, which was all about Lent. This Friday, they will be leading a worship with Year 3 children. God Bless from Mr Copley and Mrs Haines
