

Thank you so much to everyone who bought a book from our Book Fair last week. We raised a staggering £848, which means we earned £508 in return. We are hugely grateful and can't wait to spend the money on more new books for school.

Following 'Reading Rocks Week' earlier this term, we have now purchased around 350 new books for our school library. Mrs Gallucci and the Y5 librarians have been working hard to upload them on to our computerised system and they are now ready to be borrowed by our excited readers!

As you are aware, Reading is the number one priority on our school development plan, so we have been researching different strategies and approaches to reading which will inspire our children to read and also help them to make the most progress in their reading ability. In KS1, we have just invested £4000 into a new home-school reading scheme called 'Collins Big Cat', which the children are currently being assessed on. Please look out for more detailed information on this after the Easter holidays. In KS2, we have been preparing a whole new approach to home-school reading books called 'Accelerated Reader'



which Y5 and Y6 are currently being set up on, with a view to having Y3 and Y4 up and running by the Easter holidays. Again, more detailed information will be sent out after the Easter holidays. This is a huge period of change for St Francis regarding reading, so we ask you to please bear with us as we implement the changes and, as always, do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher, Mrs Haines (Assistant Head/English Leader) or Miss Jennings (Reading and Phonics Leader) if you have any questions.

National Walking Month is back this May and this year Living Streets is challenging you to **#Try20** – that is walk for 20 minutes every day. The charity for everyday walking would like you to think about how **walkable** your local streets are too.

The charity believes walking is the solution to some of our biggest problems. This simple act helps us to all be **healthier and feel**


