

Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners,

Following on from our Mission Week in October, during every worship in Lent, we have been singing our theme hymn for Lent 'Children of the Cross'. The children sing and sign this hymn beautifully and at yesterday's worship, this was no exception. Yesterday, we reflected upon a reading from the Gospel according to John which states, 'Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life.'

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In order to help us understand this quote, we looked at some video footage of Mo Farah winning the 5000m at the London 2012 Olympics, when he raised his arms up in the air as he crossed the finish line and then paraded around the stadium lifting the Union Jack flag above his head in celebration.

We also looked at a clip of Bobby Moore being lifted up by his team mates whilst he lifted up the World Cup trophy when England won the World Cup in 1966. We discussed how, at both of these events, the celebrations involved lifting something up. We remembered how we lift up our Attendance Cup and pirate hat each Friday at Merit Worship in celebration of our achievements.



Just as we hold up trophies, flags and other items in celebration, so we should hold Jesus up high and celebrate Him. We should try to praise Him and bring Him to others. After praying together, we then set our mission for the week, which is to say to someone, 'Jesus is in your heart'. Please talk to your children about this mission and see if they have fulfilled it yet.


SCHOOL NOTICES

Free School Meals

You may have noticed our free school meals stand at parent consultation evening yesterday. Mrs Laptew was asking parents if they have considered their eligibility for free school meals. The reason for this is that many parents are unaware they are entitled to other benefits if they receive free school meals. With the introduction of Universal Infant Free School Meals, the number of parents of applying for benefit-related free school meals has decreased. School also receives additional funding for your children's education for those who receive benefit related-free school meals.

You can fill in a short form online if you are in receipt of any of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided they are not receiving Working Tax Credit the 'Guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (you will need to apply directly to the school or call the Education Service on 01274 439393)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit

Please go to <u>www.bradford.gov.uk</u> and search for free school meals and there is a link to the online application form. If you are unsure if you are eligible you can still fill in the form and you will receive an instant decision.

We are seeking to recruit an experienced Classroom Support Assistant to work in Key Stage 2 from Easter until we break up in July. If you feel you have the experience for this role please speak to Mrs Haines or collect an application form from the office.
