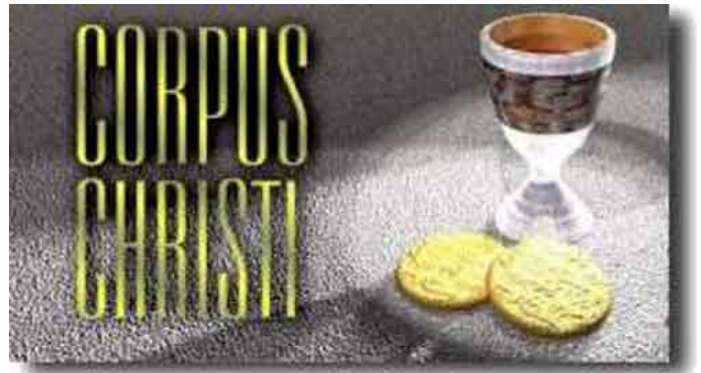

The children remembered the significant words Jesus said during this meal and how we now remember these words and actions by Jesus every Sunday at Mass when we receive the body and blood of Christ at Communion.
