On Tuesday, 25th February at 3:15 pm, our PCSO, Geoff Woodrow, will be leading an online safety session for parents immediately after the children's assembly outlined above. Last year when we held this, we were very disappointed that only one parent attended. We cannot stress enough how important it is for parents/carers to attend this session as online safety is becoming more and more complicated and problematic for our children. Our Computing curriculum educates all of our children on online safety



and in addition to this, Key Stage 2 children have regular workshops over the course of the year with our PCSO. Furthermore, our staff have annual online safety training, so we hope you can see the huge importance we put on this as part of our safeguarding and curriculum offer. The session is open to ALL our parents/carers but we are opening an online booking system for parents/carers of our Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 children, as we believe it is of particular importance to the parents/carers of children of this age.

Our After School Club will be readily available (at no cost) for children of parents/carers attending the online safety session. We look forward to seeing you there.
