Last Sunday's Gospel reading was all about the death of Lazarus. You can read it with your children below.

There was a man named Lazarus who was sick. He lived in the town of Bethany, where Mary Magdalene and her sister Martha lived. So Mary and Martha sent someone to tell Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick."

When Jesus heard this he said, "This sickness will not end in death. It is for the glory of God.



This has happened to bring glory to the Son of God." Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, but when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was for two more days. Then Jesus said to his followers, "Let us go back to Judea." The followers said, "But Teacher, the Jews there tried to kill you with stones. That was only a short time ago. Now you want to go back there?"

Jesus answered, "Are there not 12 hours in the day? If anyone walks in the daylight, he will not stumble because he can see by this world's light. But if anyone walks at night he stumbles because there is no light to help him see."

After Jesus said this, he added, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep. But I am going there to wake him." The followers said, "But Lord, if he can sleep, he will get well."



We trust you are finding all of the lessons, tasks and activities helpful in home schooling your children. As always, if you have any issues or concerns, we are always happy to help if we can.

Critical Worker Parents

We continue to offer emergency childcare for your children either here at St Francis or at St Cuthbert's (when the need is very low). As we continue providing childcare for those who need it, we will send out a link to you each Thursday in a text message, which will take you to a survey on our website. This survey will ascertain which children need our childcare provision and when for the following week. We ask you to



complete this survey as soon as you possibly can, so that we have a clear picture of the need for the following week and we can then organise staffing and provisions accordingly. **Please note: even if you do not need childcare, please fill in the form.** We are aware that circumstances can change for families after having filled the form out - families may need to isolate or shift patterns may change at late notice, etc. We are more than willing to work around this, we just ask you to email the office to update us so that we can change our arrangements in response to this. The School Disco will be rescheduled as will all other PFA plans as soon as we return to school.






