




Mila in FS2 enjoyed doing her work about being a good friend.

out whether seeds grow in certain conditions. The seed in the jars which have light have started to root! #Science






Year 3 have been looking at the story 'Once in a Lifetime'. Their first task was to create an advert to become a Sky Explorer. Here's just a few fantastic examples
