Trinity Sunday was celebrated across the church last Sunday. Our worship yesterday focussed on the big question - 'Who is God? We used the analogy of a shamrock or three-leaved clover to understand that God is one being made up of three persons - God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We reflected on how God is one community of love - each person within God loves one another and this means that God can love us more and know us more since He is made up of three persons. We also noticed how the sign of the cross reminds us of the Holy Trinity whenever we make it. We ended by praying together and setting our mission of the week: to be very careful whenever we make the sign of the cross.

Year 6: Poppy Grant for her consistent hard work and effort with her home learning. Thank you!






Mia Walker for her being so consistent in her home learning. Mia is working really hard and putting 100% effort into all her work she has been set.

Our Mathstronaut is Benjamin Matan for his amazing maths work. His shop was absolutely amazing.






## We awarded Writer of the Half Term Oscars to years 1 - 6:
