This week's worship centred around the theme of 'Do Not Be Afraid' as these were the key words that Jesus said to his disciples in this week's Sunday Gospel reading. We began by exploring different emotions and remembering times when we have felt happy, sad, angry and scared. We focussed more on the feeling of being scared and how this is an emotion that everyone experiences at some point in their life. We then looked at ways in which we can try to overcome fears - possibly by trying to distract ourselves with some of our favourite



things. We then listened to the Gospel reading according to Matthew.

We noticed how Jesus reminds us to not be afraid as He is always there for us to support and guide us through these times when we might feel fear. We ended by praying together and setting our mission for the week: to think of our favourite thing and share it with someone in our class or home.
