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

Please note: children eligible for free school meals are also eligible for financial support for school uniform.

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#### **Breakfast Club Cost**

Over the last year, our Breakfast Club has run at a loss due to the loss of income caused by the lockdowns and bubble closures. This loss of income accounts partially for our budget being extremely tight next year; even tighter than recent years with all the government budget cuts. Regrettably, myself and the Academy Councillors have made the difficult but necessary decision to increase Breakfast Club charges from £2 a session per child



including breakfast to £2.50 a session per child including breakfast. This will come into affect from September.

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#### **Summer Reading Challenge**

The Wild World Heroes Summer Reading Challenge 2021 starts on **Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> July**. It continues until the end of September. Not only does it offer children from 4 to 12 years the opportunity to continue reading during the summer holidays but also plays a key role in supporting reading catchup after a difficult year.
