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

Other Faiths Week

This week is Other Faiths week and we are learning about Judaism. One of the first thing we are learning about is how food and actions can help us understand Judaism. In each class the children are learning why doughnuts and potato latke remind Jewish people of Hanukkah. In worship yesterday, the children watched two children share their Jewish faith and traditions with their friends. We talked about how it is important to learn about our other faiths in order to understand and respect each other.



Christingle Worship



On Thursday 16th December, the children will be taking part in a Christingle worship. It is a part of our learning of how Christians celebrate Advent. On Wednesday 15th December, the children will make their own Christingle in preparation for the worship the next day. We ask if your child can please bring an orange on Wednesday15th December in order to make a Christingle.

In Foundation Stage we ask if your child can make a Christingle at home. The Foundation Stage team will send out some instructions on how to make a Christingle at home. Please can they then bring their Christingle in on Wednesday 15th December. Thank you.

Congratulations to all the Y4 children who made their Sacrament of First Reconciliation last week in church with Fr Anthony. We are so proud of them all. We pray that all the children continue to grow towards God and live as friends of Jesus.

Covid Update

Following my letter to all parents/carers last week, I would like to reiterate how important it is to remain vigilant in recognising any Covid symptoms and taking action to have yourself or your child tested if you/they display any of these symptoms. We still have a number of positive cases in school and therefore we will continue to keep all of our worships virtual at least until the end of this week. We have also postponed our Advent Mass until Wednesday 15th December at 10:30am. Our staff are continuing to wear face masks around school (not in classrooms whilst teaching) and we respectfully ask you all to continue wearing face masks when on the school site. Please support us in encouraging your children to wash their hands thoroughly and/or sanitise regularly.

Parent Survey Results

Parent Survey Results - October 2021

Thank you to the 46 parents who responded to our survey in October. Below are the results and how we are responding to your feedback which is always very much appreciated.

Overall, how happy are you with school?

93% of parents surveyed were at least very happy with school overall

Positive feedback:

Pupils are well behaved and the teaching model is perfect.

My child is happy and developing well, she has always received extra support when needed.

Our son gets a fantastic educational experience. He loves school and is making superb progress.

Friendly, hard working, caring staff and wonderful ethos.

My children are happy at this school which makes me happy

Kids are happy and love coming to school, all doing great

Areas for improvement:

I don't feel I get regular updates on how my child is progressing. I think with COVID rules still in place i.e. no face to face contact with teachers, and not being able to enter the coat room, communication needs to be increased.

Been informed by the headteacher that celebrating your child's achievements outside of school can only be done in merit assembly at the END of the school year!!!!!!

The lack of communication or being informed of changes is too late. It's so difficult to talk to the teachers as it's rushed in a morning and then feels the same on an afternoon.

Our response:

Our weekly Tuesday News is the main communication channel for all events and key messages throughout school. In addition to this, we use our text messaging service to get direct messages to parents where necessary. We hold a parents' evening in October and March where parents can talk directly to their child's teacher and we always promote contacting the school office to make an appointment with a teacher to discuss anything pertinent to your child.

Please note: children's achievements from outside of school are celebrated at Merit Worship on the last Friday of every month, not the end of the year. Apologies for any misunderstanding.

How satisfied are you with how our school supports learning?

91% of parents surveyed were at least very happy with how school supports learning

Positive feedback:

Despite lockdown she is has still carried on developing and learning well

Great communication and incentives for the children.

Always on hand if we have any queries about work

I feel the children are supported to progress and that they are encouraged to be their best without feeling pressured.

Areas for improvement:

Sometimes we are informed of what children will be learning but on occasions I have no clue what they do in class. Some classes are cancelled such as PE

I've no real idea how the school supports learning. I don't know what is in place to bridge the gap from what was missed over Covid. Maybe I'll find out more from parents' evening.

Sometimes I feel communication could be a little better ie I had no idea what sounds or words my yr 1 child has been learning

Our response:

We are hoping to reintroduce some events which include inviting parents into the classrooms to see the children learning and their work. This will include seeing Phonics lessons in KS1. Please look out for these in the Tuesday News in the new year. Of course this is all reliant on the Covid situation being safe.

Whether you go to church or not, how do you feel about it?

70% of parents surveyed feel at least very happy about church

30% of parents surveyed feel ok about church

Positive feedback:

Our faith is extremely important to us and we love how the ethos of the school supports our children in the development of their testimonies and relationship with God

There is joy in worship.

It encourages our child to support church and pray.

Areas for improvement:

Requires modernization

Needs more to keep children engaged

We used to go before the pandemic but haven't been since. I always felt uncomfortable as my son was very vocally not interested

I enjoy church, but my children are too young to sit through service. My children are very energetic and won't sit for long

Our response:

Our senior leaders, RE Leader, Academy councillors and Fr Jackson are all working together to put some special Masses in place in the new year that centre around the children.

If your child has taken a Sacrament (First Reconciliation or First Holy Communion), how did you feel about the preparation sessions?

38% of parents surveyed felt at least very happy with the sessions which took place before the pandemic

61% of parents surveyed felt ok about the sessions which took place before the pandemic

Positive feedback:

Areas for improvement:

Not enough preparation and information from school and Father to parents. It was all a bit up in the air. It needs more structure.

Our response:

We want the children and families to feel well prepared for taking their Sacraments. We are working with Mrs
Heppleston and Fr Jackson to put family catechesis in place for the new year with set dates and times

What suggestions do you have to improve your experience of going to church?

Make the hymns more lively - 53%

Have a children's liturgy - 56%

Make it more welcoming - 41%

Other - 15%

Other suggestions:

- Update and connect with modern society
- Look to increase the congregation especially amongst those families who have school aged children. Perhaps by adding a mixture of suggestions; children's literacy, family mass, social activities after mass, better links between the school and the parish so people feel more connected.
- I would suggest personal invitations, children/family friendly Sunday school lessons and that the main service is family friendly...we take Sunday themed activities for the kids to do so they don't get too noisy...maybe some simple packs for the kids?
- No need to improve
- More well known hymns
- Make it more relevant especially more appealing for children and get them involved

Our response:

Hopefully, with the special Masses we plan to put in place in the new year, we will start to address some of these suggestions and we can build on them from there.
