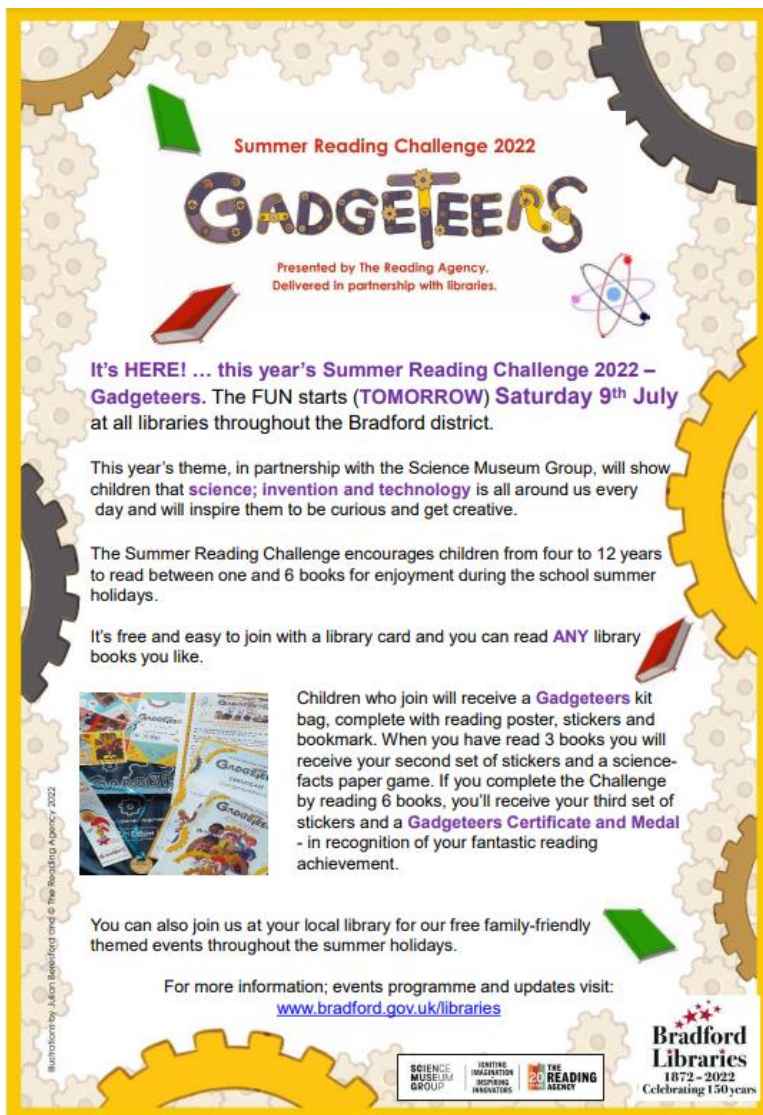

Music Concert

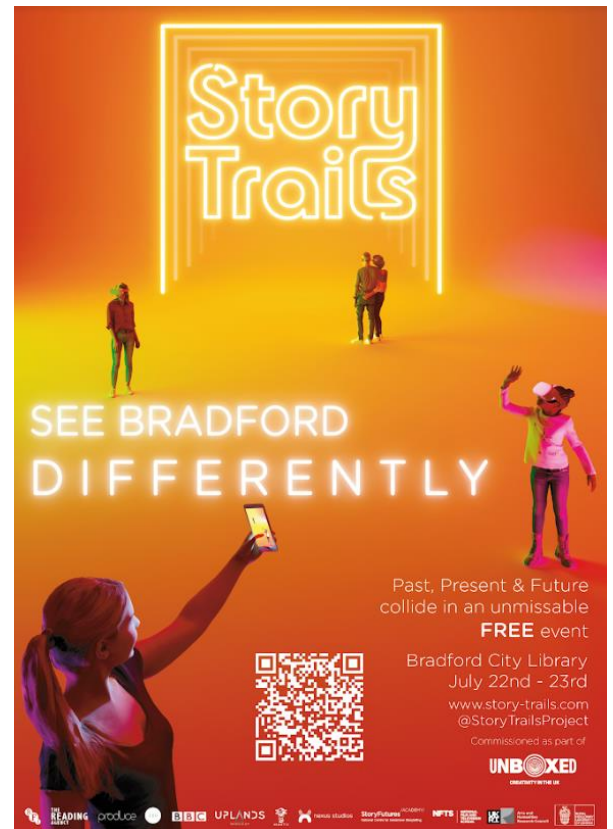
